CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

Dear friends in Christ,

***"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid."* (John 14:27)**

These words come as comfort in these unsettling times in which we live. In the aftermath of the tornados that swept through Northern Illinois on April 9th, we are reminded once again of the fragility of human life and the reality that in the blink of an eye, our lives can change drastically. It can be frightening indeed.

I think of those first disciples of Jesus and how after the crucifixion of Jesus, they huddled together behind locked doors in that Upper Room in Jerusalem. Not only were they deeply grieving the death of their leader, they were also very much afraid for their lives, wondering if what happened to Jesus would be their fate as well. After his resurrection, Jesus made several appearances to that frightened little group of followers. What did he offer them? Peace. ***"Peace be with you,"*** he said. He then showed them his hands and his side ... and the disciples rejoiced. They rejoiced because now they knew for certain that Jesus was alive! It helped to eliminate their fears.

Like those disciples of old, we sometimes choose to live behind locked doors out of our fear of the unknown. We are afraid to move out of our comfort zones, to move away from that which is familiar to us. We may be afraid of not succeeding at work, at school, or in relationships. We may be anxious about the future and the decisions facing us. We may be anxious about paying the bills or being engaged in meaningful work. We may even be afraid of death and dying, so that we can't enjoy the day that is ours.

If fear has ever gripped you and stifled your ability to function well, then be reminded of Jesus' words of comfort to his disciples. ***"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you ... Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid."*** On Sunday, May 24, we will be observing the Day of Pentecost in our congregation. This is the day we remember how the Spirit of God descended on those first disciples and empowered them to be the bold, courageous disciples they came to be.

This same Holy Spirit was given to each of us on the day of our baptism. This Spirit gives us peace ... not the kind the world can give to us ... but comes to calm our fears and ease our burdens. This Spirit comes to breathe new life into us and to fill us to overflowing. This Spirit also gives us our marching orders ... to leave rooms locked by fear ... and go out into the community to tell others that Christ is alive, sin is forgiven, and that death has met its match. Yes, the Spirit reminds us that we have work to do, being the church, but we do not go the way alone. Christ is with us. His peace will give us strength.

A LETTER FROM BISHOP GARY WOLLERSHEIM

April 10, 2015

But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; [2 Corinthians 4:7-8]

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

Grace, mercy and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ.

Last evening a powerful storm unleashed tornados across Lee, Ogle, DeKalb, Winnebago, Boone, and McHenry counties. The tornados did great damage in communities that are a significant part of our synod – “We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed.”

The latest news reports two deaths from the destructive tornados, a number of injuries, and a great deal of property damage – “...we have this treasure in clay jars.” As people of faith we may be “perplexed, but not driven to despair,” we gather with our partners and seek out the best ways to bring hope and healing in the aftermath of the storm.
