### From the Pastor

Dear Friends,

Hope you're keeping warm in these cold days we've been having! I know I'm not alone in wishing for spring to come...a day in the 40's even sounds like a treat to me!

We've just completed our annual meeting here at Shepherd of the Valley. Thanks, once again, to our outgoing church council members and to those who are continuing their council terms (Kay Brindle and Bob Maness) and to those who said "yes" to accepting a term on our council (Rhoda Fox, Vicki Nitz and Lena Lund). We approved a budget for 2014 and also approved entering into a time of discerning what God wants us to do as a congregation. For those who weren't there at the annual meeting, I want to summarize that process. (Thank you to our synod web site – [www.nisynod.com](http://www.nisynod.com) – where I was able to find this process developed by Robin & John McCulloch-Bade and Rev. Joseph Chu and Rev. Kurt Nordby)

- First we ask that *everyone* begin to pray for our congregation and this process.
- Secondly, we're forming a Mission Planning Committee (MPC) to oversee this process. Bob Maness has agreed to head up this committee – if you are interested in learning more about this or being a part of the committee, please talk to Bob.
- Soon we will be announcing an invitation for all members to participate in 3 small-group Bible study sessions on:
  - What is the purpose of the church?
  - Blessings and Confessions
  - Setting Goals
- The small group Bible studies should be no more than 10-12 people, some will be held in members' homes
- The MPC will tally the comments and suggestions from the Bible study participants.
- Small groups will be formed again to discuss how our church can serve both our members and the community.
- The MPC will once again tally comments and suggestions from those small groups and a Mission Statement, goals and action plans will be developed.
- Throughout this process, the congregation as a whole will be asked to come together for comments, revisions and approval of these plans.
- Then we'll put this plan into action!

Obviously, there is more to this process than can be easily summarized here, but I wanted to give you a sweeping overview of the process approved. I am excited about seeing where God is calling us to go! This process will only work if many of our members are a part of it. Please begin to pray for this and please plan on becoming part of the discussion. If you have questions, please speak to me or to Bob Maness.

## SOCIAL MINISTRY AND OUT-REACH

Monthly Collection will be Kid Friendly Food Bag Items for Rock House Kids. Items needed are box dry cereal (usually around one ounce), breakfast bars, nutrition bars, peanut butter crackers, cheese crackers, fruit roll ups, raisins, cookies, chips and Capri Sun drinks. They accept items that are nonperishable and can be eaten with fingers. Please no refrigerated items as well as items that need to be cooked. Items must be individually wrapped and sized. Rock House kids serve 200+ at risk children (Pre-K through 6<sup>th</sup> grade) on Monday and Wednesday nights. After lesson time is over, they send home with the children bags full of kid friendly single serving nonperishable items to have throughout the week to help with their nutritional needs.

Social Ministry Meeting will be Sunday, February 9<sup>th</sup> between services in the church library. Everyone is welcome to attend. We will be discussing items for our monthly collections throughout the year. Questions call Rhoda Fox, 815-520-3308.

**Becca's Closet Walks the Runway  
and you are invited!**

Rockford Area Lutheran Ministries invites members of your congregation to a community fashion show featuring dresses and accessories donated to Becca's Closet and modeled by area high school girls. The fashion show, entitled "Becca's Closet Walks the Runway" will be held on Saturday, March 1, 2013 in the Centre Court at Cherryvale Mall. The event is free and will highlight the mission and purpose of Becca's Closet, while raising awareness in the community of this resource. Dresses and accessories that are modeled will include formalwear donated by our Lutheran churches, members of the community, and the stores of Cherryvale Mall.

Becca's Closet is located inside Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd, 1829 North Rockton Avenue, situated directly across from West Middle School. Rockford Area Lutheran Ministries, your partnership organization of 19 area ELCA congregations, including our congregation has accepted responsibility for oversight and continued operations of the chapter.

The first Becca's Closet was the brainchild of Rebecca Kitman, a 16 year old Florida high school sophomore. Becca recognized that there were many girls in her community who were unable to attend their high school proms and homecomings because they could not afford to purchase formalwear for the dances. She launched a dress drive to provide prom dresses and accessories free of charge so that no girl would have to miss these special events. Becca was tragically killed in an automobile accident shortly after starting her "closet." Her friends and family continued the mission by forming a national "Becca's Closet" program, with 90 chapters to-date. Rockford is the only city in the state of Illinois with an active Becca's Closet chapter. The Rockford chapter serves as a boutique that collects and distributes formalwear to hundreds of young women of Rockford and the surrounding communities. More than 500 dresses are given away annually in Rockford.
