Christmas Doesn't End

As far back as I can remember, I have heard people complaining about how early "Christmas" begins. This was true back when stores had "day after Thanksgiving" sales instead of the now-ubiquitous "Black Friday" sales. It was true before certain radio stations started changing their format to all Christmas songs sometime after Halloween. It was probably true before "A Charlie Brown Christmas" contrasted all those big, shiny aluminum trees with the pathetic sapling Charlie bought.

But as valid as such complaints may be, to me they overlook the yearning our culture has for what Christmas can represent. Beneath crass commercialism lies a longing for peace on earth and goodwill to all, and behind nostalgia for Christmases past is an unfulfilled hope for more meaningful human connection in the present. At its best, Christmas—even the watered-down TV movie version—appeals to our common humanity, not our cynicism.

That's why my Christmas complaint, if you want to call it that, is not really that it starts too early, but that it ends too soon. No matter how special December 25 was, on December 26 our culture moves on. Stores have clearance racks and lines at the return counter. Media have those end-of-year "best-of" lists. People looking for connection are making New Year's Eve plans.

But don't be fooled, brothers and sisters, because Christmas is not over after one day. Christmas is not even over after 12 days (and who would remember that anyway if it weren't for that "partridge in a pear tree" song?). Christmas is an event that changes the cosmos forever after. The Christmas morning gospel from John 1 makes that clear: "And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth." God has become one with humanity and there's no going back, for God or for us.

So keep that tree up for a while. Have some egg nog in January. Share with those in need even after the bell-ringers go home. Don't stop looking for peace on earth and living with goodwill toward all. And with Mary, keep treasuring the promises of the Christ child and pondering them in your heart.





All the hopes and dreams of this place now rest on the shoulders of a handful of teenage boys. Under that heavy burden, the semi-final match becomes the catalyst for a violent act that will leave a young girl traumatized and a town in turmoil. This is a story about a town and a game, but even more about loyalty, commitment, and the responsibilities of friendship; the people we disappoint even though we love them; and the decisions we make every day that come to define us. In this story of a small forest town, Fredrik Backman has found the entire world.
