Living the Dream

When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion,
we were like those who dream.

Then our mouth was filled with laughter,
and our tongue with shouts of joy;
then it was said among the nations,

I was walking down Hillsborough Street in Raleigh, North Carolina. There were no cars or people around, but I didn't note that. Instead I thought to myself, "What am I doing here? I was here one summer, but that was a long time ago." In an instant it dawned on me: I was dreaming! I could hardly believe it, yet I knew it was true that I was dreaming an aware simultaneously.

Knowing that I was dreaming meant the tables were turned. Instead of seeing what strange or nightmarish things would happen to me, I could imagine and do anything without the consequences of reality getting in the way. (Alas, just as I was ready to try flying like a bird and eating all my favorite foods, I woke up.)

Easter is a like a dream we don't have to wake up from. The world may look the same as it did before Jesus Christ was raised from the dead, but now the victory over sin, death, and the devil is won. Being baptized into this new creation means you are no longer bound by worldly consequences but are free to be guided by Jesus' Spirit.

During Easter, our readings from Acts show us this freedom in action. Want to give all your possessions to your neighbors in need? They did it in Acts 4. Want to journey to another continent on a moment's notice? Paul did it in Acts 16. Want to live out Jesus' call even when it's risky? Read how God brought disciples through all kinds of situations, and pray for boldness like they did in Acts 4. Since Lent began, the

IFTAR Dinner to be held at Shepherd of the Valley

Iftar is the evening meal with which Muslims end their daily Ramadan fast at sunset. Muslims break their fast at the time of the call to prayer for the evening prayer. It is usually broken with dates and water, then pray the evening prayer (maghreb). After prayer a meal that usually consists of sambousa, rice (biryani), meat (chicken or beef), yogurt, juices and maybe some sweets (basbousa, sweet rice) is served.

We will be sharing this meal with our sisters from Faithful Sisterhood and out neighbors across the street ON MONDAY, May 27th.




LUTHERAN DAY IN SPRINGFIELD INFORMATION


